

Action Plan – Communication

This worksheet is designed to help readers develop a useful communication action plan using information provided in Chapter 6 (Communication) of [*The Provident Prepper: A Common-Sense Guide to Preparing for Emergencies*](#).

In an emergency, local, state or national authorities will communicate important information over the Emergency Alert System or EAS. What stations should you turn to in your area for emergency information? To find out go to <http://www.nws.noaa.gov/nwr/listcov.htm> and search for EAS stations in your area. Include any areas you visit frequently due to commute or travel. Place a label on your emergency radio so everyone knows exactly where to turn in an emergency.
