

Action Plan – Home Protection and Security

This worksheet is designed to help readers develop a home protection and security action plan using information provided in Chapter 18 (Home Protection and Security – Safe at Home) of [The Provident Prepper: A Common-Sense Guide to Preparing for Emergencies](#).

Your home is a great source of protection. It can protect you from harsh weather, dangerous people, and be a place of refuge. We prefer to stay in our home and face the challenges from our home territory that has been carefully secured and stocked with provisions whenever possible. Consider your individual circumstances and come up with a realistic plan to add layers of protection and increase the security of your home.

Your first task is to conduct a home safety inspection to discover possible hazards around your own home. See Chapter 18 for specific details. Classify your action items on the table below. Get to work on the “immediate simple” right away! Find a way to get the immediate involved completed as soon as possible, then work on the rest.
